Describe the manufacturing processes (elaborate to provide as much detail as possible)	Horsehair makes great cushioning for mattresses. When horsehair is cut from the tail and mane of the horse, it is straight. However, to be useful as cushioning in a mattress, it needs to be transformed through processing to be curly and resilient. The processing entails:	
	 Washing the horsehair in boiling water; Drying the horsehair; Combing the horsehair to remove burrs and to generally align the individuals strands so that they lie parallel; Spinning the horsehair into a yarn; Tightly twisting the yarn into rope; Heat treating the rope in steam and pressure, in order to make the curls of the hair, which comprises the rope, to become permanent; Letting the rope dry and remain undisturbed for 4-10 months; Untwisting the rope; Combing the now curly hairs; Using the hairs as cushioning for a mattress. 	
Provide dimensions / size / tolerances / performance specifications for the item	Horsehairs are generally 20 cm -120 cm. The longer they are, the better. Also, it is better to have hair from breeds and regions conducive to thicker, rather than thinner, hair. For instance, hair from certain breeds in Mongolia, South America tend to work well. Some mattress-makers report sourcing their unprocessed hair in the following manner: "The majority of our horsehair and tail hair is imported by sea from South America from countries such as Paraguay, Uruguay, Brazil or Argentina. The manes are imported via the Trans-Siberian Railway from Mongolia."	

List required materials needed to make the product, including materials of product components	 Hair from tails and manes of horses; Water; Heat to make steam; Electricity; Gas; Conveyors; Machines to comb (i.e., "pick") the horsehair. Machines to wash horsehair; Machines to dry horsehair; Units to control humidity and temperature in holding areas for hair as it cures for months. Units for cleaning/filtering air; Units for blowing air; Machines for spinning hair into yarn; Machines for spinning horsehair yarn into rope. Machines for untwisting horsehair rope.
